

Literacy and Phonics

- The children will be accessing Stories, rhymes and non-fiction books based on ourselves, our bodies and what make us the same and different
- The children will be working to develop their writing skills including writing their names.
- The children will be beginning to develop their phonic skills and learning the first sets of letter sounds and using them to segment words for writing and blend new words for reading. Children will join in with phonic games and daily phonic sessions.

Please remember to read with your children every day.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development

- The children will be working to develop their resilience and to keep on trying.
- They will be learning to develop their sharing skills and how to be a good friend.
- They will be learning how to keep safe in a range of contexts.

Homework

Reading daily, sounds of the week.

Communication and Language

- Children will be involved in repeating sounds and patterns games.
- They will develop their listening and attention skills as we read stories and learn facts from different adults, as well as following and responding to instructions.
- The children will be sharing their ideas with their peers both independently and within group activities.

Mathematics

- The children will be developing their number skills through number rhymes and counting games.
- They will be exploring 'flat' (2D) shapes and finding shapes in the environment as well as making pictures with shapes
- They will be developing their understanding of aspects of comparing length, weight and capacity.

Computing

- The children will have access to a range of devices to take photos, record their voices and make video recordings
- They will have opportunities to develop their computer skills to open and use a range of programs.

Physical Development

- The children will play a range of games during PE getting them to follow instructions and develop spatial awareness.
- They will have the opportunity to develop Gross Motor Skills (GMS) in the outdoor area through running, constructing and using bikes and scooters.
- They will begin to develop their Fine Motor Skills (FMS) through a range of guided and independent activities involving threading, tweezer work, scissor work and pencil skills.

Understanding the World

- The children will be looking at aspects of themselves and, through songs and games learning and naming parts of the body.
- They will be looking at some of the things that make them the same and different from each other.

Expressive Arts and Design

- The children will begin develop their DT skills through a range of independent and guided activities
- The children will develop their creative skills through both guided and independent activities using a range of media.
- They will learn a range of songs and develop their skills at following patterns using musical instruments.
